To clarify the settlement...

- present model setting out what the National Assembly can do is complex and unclear
- recommend model setting out what National Assembly cannot do – the "conferred powers model"
- overwhelming evidence in favour of change.





Coherent powers exercised at the right level:

- does the Welsh Government have the powers it ought to have?
- many areas examined
- next slides give some headline conclusions
- but much more detail in the report





Energy, water and transport

- increase threshold for devolved energy consents
- align devolved competence for water with national boundary – though further work on impact on consumers needed
- more powers over rail, ports, bus and taxi regulation
- devolve speed and drink/drive limits.



Policing, justice and broadcasting

- devolution of most aspects of policing
- phased approach to devolution of justice system, starting with devolution of youth justice
 but court system and prisons also considered
- funding for S4C transferred, but regulation of broadcasting at UK-level
